

## 1916 DIARY

		<b>1916 - This brief account of a woman's trip to New York was chronicled in a diary whose cover is stamped "1907". However, the author clearly dated her entry as "1916." Other than this brief chronicle, the remainder of the diary is blank.</b>
		<b>MARCH</b>
MAR 31, 1916	<b>MON</b>	<i>Went to Lewiston this morning after shopping. Called to see Mrs. Putnam and Flora. Then went to Dr. Philoon's and spent the night.</i>
MAR 1, 1916	<b>SAT</b>	<i>Started at 7 o'clock for Boston. Albert met me to find the train for N.Y. Arrived in N.Y. about 9 o'clock (one hour late). George met me there and we were soon in Brooklyn.</i>
MAR 2, 1916	<b>SUN</b>	<i>Went to Church with George to hear Mr. Holmes at the Church of the Messiah. In the P.M. went with George and Georgie. Walked down Broadway. Visited Trinity. Went down Wall St. Saw the Stock Exchange. The Statue of Washington. Visited St. Paul's Church and sat in the Washington Pew.</i>
MAR 3, 1916	<b>MON</b>	<i>Rested.</i>
MAR 14, 1916	<b>TUE</b>	<i>Card Party - Mrs. Ketchum, Mrs. Lewis, and Mrs. Watt –</i>
		<b>APRIL</b>
APR 5, 1916	<b>WED</b>	<i>Went to the museum. Saw the Altman Collection. "The Old Woman Cutting her Nails" by Rembrandt. The Morgan pictures and "Horse Fair". The tomb of Perneb from Egypt. Rode down Fifth Avenue on a bus to Washington Square. Then came home by subway.</i>
APR 6, 1916	<b>THU</b>	<i>Rested.</i>
APR 7, 1916	<b>FRI</b>	<i>Went to the Hippodrome.</i>
APR 8, 1916	<b>SAT</b>	<i>Stormy</i>
APR 9, 1916	<b>SUN</b>	<i>Stormy</i>
APR 10, 1916	<b>MON</b>	<i>Met Mrs. Hayes at subway and when to Columbia College. Walked by the library down Morningside Park to the Cathedral of St. John the Divine. Then went up Riverside Park to Grant's Tomb. Rode on a bus to 35th St. Lunched at Hotel Collingwood. Then went to McCreery's Waldorf Astoria. Altman and Tiffany's. Saw the Tiffany diamond valued at \$56,000. Necklace \$33,000. The pendant once belonged to the Sultan of Turkey. Came home by subway.</i>
APR 11, 1916	<b>TUE</b>	<i>Went to the tower of the Wentworth building. 58 stories. View fine in all directions. Hudson River, East River. Saw the German ships.</i>
APR 12, 1916	<b>WED</b>	<i>Heard Forbes-Robertson in "Passing of the Third Floor Back".</i>
APR 13, 1916	<b>THU</b>	<i>Called to see Mrs. Lewis.</i>
APR 14, 1916	<b>FRI</b>	<i>Stormed.</i>
APR 15, 1916	<b>SAT</b>	<i>Went to see the Edmund's baby. From there to Prospect Park.</i>
APR 16, 1916	<b>SUN</b>	<i>Heard Rabbi Wise "The Jew in Fiction and the Fiction about the Jew"</i>
APR 17, 1916	<b>MON</b>	<i>Started for home at 9:30 P.M. First Sunday we walked down Clinton Avenue past the Pratt Houses. Visited Pratt one day. Callers - Fred Elliott, Mrs. Lewis, Mrs. Walt, Mrs. Ketchum and son, Mrs. Hayes, Miss Bryant.</i>
